# Food Security through Improved Agriculture

We work with marginalized small and medium farmers having challenges in agriculture field. Despite of owing farmland, they are struggling to have better yield. Thus, the organization is giving special attention on agriculture, with the focus on stabilization of the main crops.

Mostly paddy is grown as main crop, which is the staple food in the working area. However, JVP believes in enhancing the potential of farmers without any gender discrimination. It helps them diversify into cash crop, vegetable cultivation on the homestead and pulses as field crops.

In the period under review, training program on Natural Resource Management, crop management, organic farming, System of Rice Intensification, kitchen garden and linkages with government department were provided to 416 men and women. Apart from formal training, JVP guided them in developing agriculture field for vegetable cultivation and kitchen garden. 150 families developed kitchen garden which is helping them to get nutritional food intake. 67 farmers adopted System of Rice Intensification. 143 women developed as master trainers who are presently generating awareness in the community at large.

During the year, focus was given on encouraging women, facilitating them to realize their greater role in agriculture sector. To combat the irrigation challenge, plan had been developed with the community to establish linkages with Jharkhand Tribal Development Society, Block Agriculture Office and MNREGA for improvement of irrigation facilities and farmlands. 83 families got saplings and seeds from ATMA.



## Better yield brings joy in our family

40 years old Pansuri Marandi lives at Chitlo Village with her husband Churka Murmu(44 Years) and the children; two daughters and one son. The economic condition of Pansuri and her family were not good at all. She had to borrow money frequently from the money lenders at high interests for fulfil her daily expenditures. The family basically depends on small scale agriculture and Non Timber Forest Products (NTFP) like leaves for their livelihood.



The JVP team guided Chitlo to form Self Help Groups in order to give them an economic boost. Pansuri Marandi joined the SHG as a member. After join in a SHG Pansuri realized two kinds of benefits, one they could now save a little amount of money on a monthly basis.

Now she doesn't have to borrow money from the money lenders at the time of need. She now borrows money from her very own group at minimum interest rate which gives her family some economic stability. She also gained knowledge on System of Rice Intensification which she applied in her own agriculture field.

# Women Self Help Groups- A platform for Social Mobilization

Women are the best creator of sustainable global society. They create values through words and action in the place where they are now. They are the role model for social mobilization. It gives us immense pleasure to see most disadvantaged women from Indigenous community united, spreading awareness on Income Generating Activities, savings, health and hygiene, taking part in accessing entitlements and other development activities.

During the year, the organization has designed capacity building programs namely book keeping management, good governance, accessing entitlements, Agriculture and Natural Resource Management and health & hygiene. 60 Women Self Help Groups having 845 members are playing vital role in creating a peaceful society. 143 women developed as master trainer for facilitating knowledge on agriculture.

Women meet regularly, and make tangible improvements in their lives around economic and social realms. The methodology adopted is to build these grass-roots groups around a very tangible activity of pooling small savings and credit, which is an



everyday need for poor families. The initial focus of JVP is on the stabilization of group processes and systems.

# Governance and Entitlements

JVP placed its emphasis on traditional systems and strengthening of the village bodies to ensure good governance with full participation of all the beneficiaries, both men and women, in decision making and achieving equity in ownership and access of government services.

The support of JOHAR Project enables the formation of Tribal Rights Forum which helps in accessing the government services on time. This forum also addresses the rights of tribal and indigenous people. This program aims at capacity building of members of Panchayati Raj Institutions.

It encourages involvement of men and women in planning, monitoring and budgeting of different village development program. Transparency in budget allocation, preparation of work plan and implementation of different MNREGA related work been taken care by the community.

- *22 Girls linked under Laxmi Ladali Yojana (LLY)*
- *'25 Hand pumps have been Maintenance by PHED Department.*
- *Vacant posts of AWW have been filled up in 04 AWCs.*
- *05 Vacant post of Sahiaya has been selected.*
- *64 SHG members benefited by Pradhanmanti Ujjwala Yojana .*
- *485 people worked under MNREGA scheme like –Dobha, Pond, land labelling and well.*
- *62 SHGs member have adopted leaf plate making as their major source of income generation. Total earn Rs.57,600/-*
- *21 SHGs Groups are linked with JSLPS (Jharkhand State livelihood Promotion Society). And 21 SHGs received First and second Instalment received Rs-7,35,000/- .*
- *16 Group are linked with JTDS (Jharkhand Tribal Development Society). And each received Ten Thousand, hence total amount received by eleven SHGs Rs-1,60,000/-*
- *12 women CBO members received Sewing machine from Labour Department*
- *13 CBO members receive Bicycle from Labour Department.*
- *08 CBO Irrigation Machine receive from Agriculture Department.*

# Adolescent Empowerment

JVP carried especially adolescent empowerment program among adolescent girls belong to primitive tribes (Paharia) and Tribal community. It mainly implemented to address adolescent health namely Education, Behaviors Change Communication, Menstrual Hygiene, Nutrition and Entitlements.

The organization has succeeded in mobilizing adolescents in the form of 31 groups having 775 members. These groups become a platform for open discussion to gain knowledge on issues related to their development.

Capacity Building Program namely Behavior Change Communication, Life Skill Training, Health and Hygiene, Career guidance arranged for the adolescents to make them aware of living a dignified life. Street play group also existing in the village who are generating awareness on social issues like human trafficking, right age of marriage, nutrition, education and services.

# Child protection and rights

CHILDLINE India Foundation (CIF) is the nodal agency of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development acting as the parent organization for setting up, managing and monitoring the CHILDLINE 1098 service all over the country.

CHILDLINE 1098 service is a 24 hour free emergency phone outreach service for children in need of care and protection. CIF undertakes replication of CHILDLINE, networking and facilitation, training, research and documentation, and Communications and Strategic Initiatives both at the national and international level.

This is a project supported by the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development and linking state Governments, NGOs, bilateral /multilateral agencies and corporate sector . CIF is responsible for the establishment of CHILDLINE centres across the country. CIF also functions as a national center for awareness, advocacy and training on issues related to child protection.

JVP is one of the Partners in implementing CHILDLINE Program. During the reporting period, one Block Level Advisory Board Meeting 3866 is the total outreach. 86 cases administered. 20 abuse cases protected. 59 medical cases received. Wall writing in 11 places done for the publicity of CHILDLINE.
