Genesis:

The Chief Functionary of the organization Ms. Subasini Soren is very actively involved in the sector of social service after her graduation from Pakur district of Jharkhand with number of NGOs in Bihar, now in Jharkhand. While working with NGOs, she felt that she should initiate her own initiative in the sector of Rural Development with her ideologies and attitudes and formed the organization named 'Jharkhand Vikas Parishad' with the likeminded people of Mandu block of Hazaribagh. The organization has been registered in the month of June 2000. Since its inception, the organization has been working for the rural poor with special reference to women and children. In the due course of action, the organization is intervening for the development of women and child through formation and promotion of women's groups, non-formal education, health & hygiene camps, environment camps, integration & promotion of traditional festivals, village meetings, capacity building training, organizing advocacy workshop on women's issues and promotion of livelihood activities to ensure Food Security.

Our Vision:

JVP is striving its hard through its various integrated actions to attain an established, egalitarian, non-exploitative and socially just society with economic self-reliance.

Our Mission

Organizing people at grass root level for their social, economic development and empowerment through identification of needs of the people and develop a process of people's empowerment as the owner of the creation.

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Key Intervention Areas: JVP's thrust areas are CBO's formation and strengthening, Social Awareness on Rights and Entitlements, Women Empowerment, Child rights, Education with special emphasis on RTE, Health, Natural Resource Management, Sustainable Organic Agriculture, SRI, Watershed Management, Ensure Food Security with special reference on MGNREGA and Advocacy,

"KAM MANGO ABHIYAN"

Jamugoria is one of the seven village of Jamugoria panchayat of Amrapara Block of Pakur district. This village consists of 315 household and the total population is 1586 out of which only 279 people are literate. The main source of income of this village is Agriculture and daily labour. And this agriculture depends on rain water. There is one primary school as well as one middle school in this village.

Appprox 200 family had job card in this village, inspite of that they never gone to the panchayat office anytime for demanding Job or for submitting application for job. The middleman use to keep their job card with them and in return provide few days job to them. The villagers were too much happy and satisfied with this scenario.



But when PACS staff went to this village and come to know about this scenario they decided to start KAM MANGO ABHIYAN in this village. They mobilize all the villagers and told them in details about MGNREGA and make them aware of the importance of Job card and job available under MGNREGA kanoon. Villagers became motivated and decided to went to the panchayat for demanding job. Around 160 people including SHG members, PRI members and Villagers went to the panchayat in a group along with PACS staff to demand for job. They gave a written job application to the panchayat rojgar sevak and demand for 14 days job in this month. Rojgar sevak disagreed to receive the application and provide job to them at present. But the villagers forced him to provide job to them and at last when he find that the villagers will not move from the panchayat office unless they get job assurance then he promise the villagers to provide job (Road construction and Well construction) within one month. After few days 131 people of this panchayat received job.

Social Empowerment:

To empower the society is the best way to for their development. Deprived villagers are unaware about their rights and entitlements. JVP had organized Community development training and leadership training for the elected PRI members and Block level advocacy meeting for the PRI members. Awareness and training had been organized for better participation in Gram Sabha and awareness and access to Government schemes with special emphasis on MGNREGA. Formation and strengthening of CBO's especially Self Help Group for rural women's for their socially & economically liberty. JVP in this tenure formed 100 SHGs in our targeted villages.

Formation and strengthening Women's Cooperative named "Mahila Vikas Kray Kendra" is our prime success in the field of community development.

Child Rights:

"Child are the future of the society" keeping this thought in mind we are keen to restore the rights of the children and organized short duration Life Skill camp for the adolescent children . It enable the adolescent girls to fill in the gap in between "knowledge gap practices" through motivation, social influences, removing the misconception, myths, beliefs, rumors and moving gradually towards the "Knowledge, Attitude and Practices (KAP)" behavior.

Children's day Celebration- To celebrate children's day, Sports; Songs and Drawing competition had been organized on 14th November day at Paderkola where the

students from the VLC's and surrounding govt. Schools had been participated. This type of curricular activities increased the self confidence of the adolescents as well as of the students.



Education:

JVP's endeavors to mainstreaming the dropout children and the children of migrated parents lead us to take several steps including awareness meeting and training, distribution of Resource material, books and stationery for learning centres: Educational materials had been provided to the

Adolescents girls at the beginning of the academic year. Books, copies, white paper, pencils blackboard, sketch pen, rubber, cutter Colour pencils and chart paper has been distributed to the Adolescents girls to motivate them to come to the centre daily.

Health:

"Health is the wealth of life". In this region health hazards are serious problem and to mitigate the problem we have undertake several awareness and training program to restore health and hygiene of the deprived people. We had organized 12 trainings where Sahiya, ICDS worker and 429 village people participated and learnt about seasonal diseases, neo-natal care, post-natal care, child immunization, nutrition, HIV/AIDS, Kalaazar Malaria and Diarrhea.

Awareness on safe drinking water and use of hygienic sanitation in village area were also in our important endeavor in the field of health sector.

Agriculture:

To promote sustainable agriculture JVP had organized 17 trainings to cover 531 villagers which consist of organic farming, use of green manure, organic pesticide, vegetable cultivation, conservation of local seeds and collective farming.

We had special emphasis on promotion of SRI technology in rice cultivation which paved the way for rural people to cultivate scientifically and earn more yield from small land. 187 Farmers started cultivating paddy using SRI technology.

JVP wants to promote sustainable bio-farming so we had organized training on farm pond, NADEP, and vermin-compost also organized for the farmer for their sustainable agriculture

Livelihood:

To mitigate poverty and fight against migration for work JVP always keen to generate livelihood sources for alternative income. Vocational Training on sustainable agriculture had been organized for the villagers. 30 kg. Arhar seeds had been distributed to 14 families 50 kg. Wheat seeds had been distributed to 2 SHG groups for SWI. 3.5 quintal kg Potato seeds had been given to 6 SHG group's respectively. 110 farmers participated in Vermin compost preparation, NADEP, Vermin vast and Matka khad preparation.

Summer vegetables have distributed to 11 SHG groups. Apart from this for water management, 10 farm ponds had been introduced in 10 villages.
