

About the Organization

The Chief Functionary of the organization is Ms. Subasini Soren who is actively involved in the sector of social service, just after her graduation from Pakur district of Jharkhand. While working with number of NGOs in Bihar and Jharkhand she felt that she should initiate her own initiative in the sector of Rural Development with her ideologies and attitudes and formed the organization named 'Jharkhand Vikas Parishad with the likeminded people of Mandu block of Hazaribagh.

The organization has been working with the tribal (Santhals, Munda) & primitive tribal (SauriaPaharia, Paharia) groups as a priority, then with the Dalits (harijans) & Muslim in Pakur & Hazaribagh district of Jharkhand. The organization has FCRA. They have 15 trained staff both at the office and at the field level. Their coverage area is under one district, namely Pakur which is the furthest district of the state.

Most of the activities undertaken by the organization are related to community work, women empowerment, nutrition, health and NRM. Organization had kept strong relationship with block and district administration.

In the due course of time, the organization took step forward with formation and promotion of women's groups, non-formal education, health & hygiene camps, environment camps,

integration & promotion of traditional festivals, village meetings, capacity building training, organizing advocacy workshop on women's issues and promotion of livelihood activities to ensure Food Security.

The organization is working with the tribal (Santhals, Munda) & primitive tribal (SauriaPaharia, Paharia) groups as a priority, then with the Dalits (harijans) & Muslim in Pakur district of Jharkhand. The project area of the intervention presents a picture of mixed heterogeneous society consisting of Tribal, Harijans, Muslims, Hindi and Bengali speaking people with different languages, cultures and heritages. The communities are poverty stricken, marginal farmers, agriculture laborers and landless laborers.

Jharkhand Vikas Parishad has been working on rural development issues with special reference to women empowerment since its inception. Based on our working experience with the women we realized that women empowerment is possible only if these rural women earn some money by themselves.

In the process of formation of SHG, women were given various training to make them aware about their rights and entitlement issues. Some SHG groups are linked with banks for the loan facilities where as some other SHG groups have already taken loan to do the income generating activity. The JVP is further approaching to link

with Market for the sale of SHG production, Health promotion & advocacy for health rights. JVP through their intervention on health have tried to sensitize people about the health Services. Series of health camps were organized, children and pregnant ladies were encouraged to go for the immunization at their nearby PHC. Agriculture promotion: To improve the agriculture production by use of vermin - compost, adoption for new agricultural technology to address towards increase in productivity.

JVP also made linkages with government to get benefit from the SGSY , MNREGA and other Schemes. The close association with Government departments supported JVP for resource mobilization. The JVP was able to mobilize the fund from the SGSY fund for SHG strengthening and facilitating credit linkages for supporting livelihood initiatives, etc.

Major activities and events Organized by Jharkhand Vikas Parishad from April 2015 to March 2016 With Support of Child Line Project:-

Over 110 children along with people from various walks of life participated in the rally organized by Jharkhand Vikash Parishad With Support of Child Line to create awareness on Child Right & child protection on 14th November 2015. The participants carried CHILD LINE Banner and distributed pamphlets. The rally created awareness among the people about the need to protect vulnerable children on the street and elsewhere. On the occasion, children tied suraksha bandhan to Mr. Pramesh Kushwaha (B.D.O), Mr. Ranjeet Minj (police inspector), Mrs. Chitra Yadav (C.D.P.O), Mrs. Sushila Murmu (B.E.O), Dr. Prem Kumar Marandi (Medical Incharge).



Major activities and events Organized by Jharkhand Vikas Parishad from April 2015 to March 2016 with support of Johar Project:-

Jharkhand Vikas Parishad play a vital role to Awareness building and Empowering tribal Communities Through Nukar Natak ,Training, Meeting and workshop.

Some of the Major Activity is following:-

- Community mobilization camps.
- Establish a network of 400 local level self-help groups.
- Provide training and support to the SHGs in organizational management and livelihoods.
- Raise awareness and train CBO/TRF members on their rights to access public schemes.
- Create public information centres at PRI level
- Establish 150 new CBOs and strengthen 90 existing CBOs (target: 240 by end of Year 1 - 120 per state)
- Unite the local level CBOs to form district, state and inter-state Tribal Rights Forums .
- State Level Tribal Right Forum:
- Training of local level government workers (PRI representatives and MGNREGA officials).

Impact:

- CBOs now sharing their problems before Block Govt. Officials.
- With the help of Public Information Centre CBOs members are applying to relevant deptt. Regarding their problems.
- CBO members are participating and empowering *Gram Sabha*.
- People are now aware of Govt. scheme and properly monitored by them.
- People have developed their knowledge on different public schemes and are lobbying for the same at block level administration.

- 22 SHGs are operating different Income Generating Activities.
- 21 SHG are empowered to apply independently for the different schemes and lobbying with the govt. Officials.
- SHG members have increased their skill on how to sustain the group in future.
- The total saving of 50 SHGs have reached to Rs, 3,01256/- (Three Lack One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Six Only)
- 19 SHGs are independently maintaining records.
- 14 SHGs have been linked and benefiting from NRLM.
- 20 SHGs are operating inter loaning activities.
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Major activities and events Organized by Jharkhand Vikas Parishad from April 2015 to March 2016 With Support of SDTT Project:-

Jharkhand Vikas Parishad working to support of SDTT in 38 forest villages and habitations of Amrapara block to increase the reach of the Trust's program for adolescent education and development in Jharkhand. These communities had low participation in education and have been deprived of opportunities for development due to exploitation and official negligence. A majority of the adolescent girls in the 12-18 years age group from Pahariya and Santhals tribal community are illiterate. The female literacy rate is as low as 16.28percent and the dropout rate from class 1-10 is 85 percent in Pakur district. To increase the Literacy Rate Jharkhand Vikas Parishad is doing following work with support of SDTT:-

(i). **Village Learning Centers:** 15 VLC had been formed covering the population of 38 villages. For running these centres effectively we had appointed 15 female teachers and provided Blackboard, Carpet,

Books, Copies and Library and all other necessary materials which were essential for the running successfully of VLC.

(ii) **Provided Resource material, books and stationery for learning centers:** Educational materials had been provided to the Adolescents girls at the beginning of this academic year2015. Books, copies, pen, Colour pencils, chat paper has been distributed to the Adolescents girls to motivate them to come to the centre daily.

(iii).**Library Setup:** We stabilised a library for adolescent girl at PIC Amrapara which is in the centre of all VLC. Adolescent girl coming to library which opens for three days in a week i.e Tuesday, Wednesday and Saturday.

(iv).**Women and Adolescent group Forum and Meeting:** We had been 24 Women and Adolescent group formed in this period. In this group 280 women and 307 Adolescent are regular member of this group.

: For the Cultural, Social and mental development we have organized Bal Mela on occasion of Children's day for Adolescent girl of "Village Learning Centre" Sri Anil Kumar Yadav, BDO Amrapara, inaugurated "BAL Mela" at "Fatehpur



Football Ground” in the presence of Smt. Subasini Soren, Secretary cum Project Director, all member of Jharkhand Vikas Parishad & teacher and adolescent of village Learning Centre, Fatehpur School Teachers and the entire community participated for the event. Dance, Songs, Painting, Quiz Competitions, Musical Chair, Relay, and lots of Sports were conducted during this day long mela. Also we had distributed prize to the adolescent girls for 1st, 2nd and 3rd winners in all game. (For 1st prize Lunch Box, 2nd Plate, 3rd Glass and also some prize for runner-ups pen etc.).

Major activities and events Organized by Jharkhand Vikas Parishad from April 2015 to March 2016 Under Kfb Project:-

JVP, with the support of KFB/DKA initiated a three year project in to create conducive environment for ensuring effective Implementation of Community Mobilization and Livelihood Promotion program in 31 villages of Littipara block of pakur district.



The main Objectives of this Project is:-

(i).To empowers Traible Women in ensuring rights and entitlements by Promoting their Livelihood through convergence, support awareness and skill building.



(ii).To empowers the adolescent girls in ensuring rights and entitlement through awareness building in the Community.

(iii).To revives and promotes traditional healing system in the tribal area.

(iv).To strengthens the service Provider, stakeholder through lobbying and advocacy to make available of good services.

To Reach this objective JVP has Conducting following Activity:-

- One Day Basic Health care Training.
- One day Training on Agri & NRM.
- Two days Capacity Building Training.
- Two days Training on the identification of herbal leafs, plants and their uses.
- One Day Meeting with ICDS, ANM, and Sahiya for provide good service to community.
- One Day Net work and Linkage meeting with Block level Officials and PRI Members.
- One day workshop on Govt. Schemes at Block Level.
- One day monthly Meeting with Kishori group and Mahila SHGs.



Impact:-

-) 89 families started keeping and taking safe drinking water and safe toilet practicing.
-) 140 families started giving homemade medicine (Ex-A glass mixture of lemon, salt and water, Pudina Juice, Roosted Mango Juice etc.) To their children in case of diarrhoeal and take precaution in cough and cold and other respiratory problems.
-) Total 252 people are using mosquito net and other means to protect from malaria.
-) 53 women received TT 178 children received immunization
-) 38 women took the benefit of Janani suraksha yojana.
-) 46 Trained SHGs groups are conducting regular monthly meeting and about 80% members are present during the meeting
-) They begun to raise their problems after discussion in group.
-) Communication of trained SHGs have Improved so they were working as a Team and supported each other in difficulties and followed all the listed Rules and Regulation Prepared by SHGs.
-) 30 household are using herbal medicine.
-) 60 women are practicing Natural resource in their own land.
-) 30 women are making vermin compost cow dung and also using it in their agricultural land.

Major activities and events Organized by Jharkhand Vikas Parishad from April 2015 to March 2016 With Support of PACS Project:-

The discriminatory practices in accessing MGNREGA and its provisions have excluded the communities especially ST, SC and OBC due to various intentional bureaucratic bottlenecks. This has led to non-enrolment of job cards, delay in payment and lack of awareness about its provisions, etc. The communities were not at all involved in the planning processes and



were not aware of its processes and provisions. This has further led to rampant migration for want of casual labour/employment from the proposed area. Therefore, this project tried to address

in mitigating migration and ensure supplementary livelihood for the socially excluded groups under the MNREGA schemes.

The project made an effort to reduce the gap in MNREGA scheme through Empowerment of women and excluded communities and mainstreaming of MNREGA program to ensure food security and reduction of poverty in 60 villages of Amrapara & Littipara block of Pakur district, Jharkhand.

Impact

- 2282 people aware about MGNREGA Scheme.
- No. of Job Cards Issued - 5969
- No. of households who have availed job under MGNREGA due to efforts under PACS project – 1260.

To aware the Community People, Guardian and Student Jharkhand Viks Parishad Organized School Chalo Abhiyan in their Project Area. Through the Rally JVP Try to build Positive energy among the



student, for this organization has made Motivational dialogue. Keeping into account of the goal of JVP, “All Children to be in school”, JVP has organized School Chalo campaign in Littipara, Jamjori and Surajbera Panchyat of Pakur district in the month of April 2015. The campaign was organized in close collaboration with school teachers who were intensively involve in survey and door to door contact to ensure 100% enrollment. Right to Education also includes a responsibility to provide basic education to children who have not completed primary education. In addition to this right to education encompasses the obligation to rule out discrimination at all levels in the educational system, to set minimum standards and improve quality of education. JVP calls up School chalo campaign to ensure no children are left out from school in their intervention area under PACS, KFB and SDTT. JVP has undertaken School Chalo

Abhiyan during school admission period; grass root level efforts have produced tangible results. As an outcome of the campaign 356 children from target area got enrolled into regular school is increasing progressively.
